COURSE TOUR



This lovely 557 yard par 5 hole has the only rise on the course. The hole derives its name from the time when Queen Victoria travelled by Royal Yacht Britannia via the River Cart to be entertained by Lord Blythswood in his impressive House on the estate. There is an interesting feature on this hole: just before the 200 yard marker on the left side there is a small circle of trees. Depending who you ask this was either where all the animals of the old house were buried, or a feature outside the pantry of the old house, designed to keep away evil spirits.



Named after the estate the course is built on, this impressive par 4 of 421 yards dogleg right has been the downfall of many players the end of their medal rounds. A difficult at second shot to a sloping green.
